Lessons from a Sabbatical in Berlin

Earlier this year, I took much needed time off and spent part of my Sabbatical in Berlin, Germany.

During my four weeks in Berlin, I studied German half the day and partook in the city's cultural, historical, and Jewish offerings during the other half. The history of Berlin in the twentieth century is as tumultuous as no other city in Europe. Amid political upheavals, the German capital became the site of some of the most creative achievements in Jewish religious thought the world had ever known. In particular, the interwar period witnessed Jewish culture's flourishing in Berlin. During the Weimar Republic, the first liberal democracy in German history, the Jews of Berlin would shine as an example of a successful and integrated Jewish community.

As vibrantly as it may impress the casual visitor, Berlin's current *Jüdische Gemeinde* (the official Jewish community) is but a pale reflection of what it once was. For someone like myself, who for the last thirty years has encountered Jews from Berlin in person—as congregants, teachers, and colleagues—and also in their wonderful writings and cultural artifacts, it is hard to say that I had a "wonderful" time in Berlin. As one walks the streets of Berlin, it is as if a dark cloud hangs over the city (during the month of March, it often literally does!), a cloud that one cannot escape. Despite the tremendous destruction and loss of life that first the Nazis and then the Allied bombing rained upon the city, it is not possible, at least not for me, to take a walk in Berlin and merely enjoy it. In that city, in that land, God's words to Cain resonate like nowhere else on earth, "the voice of your brother's blood cries out to me from the earth" (Gen. 4:10).

This is not to say that one should not visit Berlin or Germany. On the contrary, we have an obligation to learn about what was lost, to visit every site, to read every plaque, to take every picture, and to bear witness that *am yirael chai*, the Jewish people still lives and thrives. Because I take this obligation seriously, I spent a month in Berlin. Everyone concerned with the Jewish past and present must come to terms with Germany and its people. So, I invite you to join me as we come together for two special editions of our *Beit Midrash* centered on the past and present of two Jewish communities of Germany: Rhineland and Berlin. 
