The Finance Committee has been hard at work finalizing our next budget so the Board of Trustees can review and present it to the congregation at the annual meeting in May. The budget is a projection and guide for our income and expenses for the following fiscal year. It is a financial road map for us to follow and keeps us out of trouble as it pertains to our income and expenses.

One area that has not been updated for some time is our vision and strategic plan. Our vision is *what do we see?*, or *what would we like to see our congregation look like now and in the future?*. Our strategic plan is the road map to implement our vision and move us forward.

On a different note, I want to make everyone aware of another program we are resurrecting. It is the *Beth Torah Legacy Giving Program*. Barry Katz is chairman for this initiative. Legacy giving refers to donations that congregants can give to Beth Torah after their passing. It is also referred to as Planned Giving. Donors plan these gifts years before they are distributed. Gifts of life insurance, charitable annuities, charitable remainder trusts, stocks or securities are a few examples. This is an easy way to ensure Beth Torah stays vibrant for your family after you are gone. Barry will be introducing this with more information shortly.

# Social Justice

For many years, CBT's social justice network was highly engaged in hunger projects. Unfortunately, our long-time partnership with re-Start ended several years ago. The State of Missouri established rules that required background checks for volunteers if children were housed in the location. The cost for each security review was prohibitive, so we withdrew from the program.

We are pleased that beginning on March 1, we will be supporting a volunteer organization whose mission is to deal with food issues facing the homeless. *Free Hot Soup* is a Facebook-based organization that provides food at several locations in Kansas City and serves as a liaison between people with housing and food needs and those who can provide donations. The volunteer group also collects used clothing for the unhoused and furniture for individuals who are making the transition between living on the streets and permanent housing. I am so pleased that Mindy Goldstein has agreed to spearhead this project.

Our initial support for **Free Hot Soup** will focus on clothing needs, particularly clothing that is essential for staying warm in the winter months without shelter. Our members can drop-off clothing in the Beth Torah entryway near a well-labeled barrel. The needs of **Free Hot Soup's** clients will dictate the types of donations we request.

For the months of March and April, the emphasis is on articles that help people weather the cold. This includes warm clothing, heavy socks, gloves, flashlights, large men's gloves, AAA batteries, large and XL hoodies. Our progress can be posted on the Tekiah, CBT website, and weekly CBT News. # **Volunteer Opportunities**

### Would You Or Your Family Like to Volunteer for Shabbat at CBT?

We are always looking for people to volunteer and to accept honors at CBT during Services. We would love for you or your family to be one of our volunteers or accept an honor while you attend services on Friday night or Saturday morning!

One must be Jewish to perform the following:

- Light Shabbat Candles on the Bimah You may chant or recite the blessings on your own or with Lezlie. The congregation will join you.
- Raise the Kiddush Cup at the Oneg on Friday night or on Saturday morning. Kiddush is a group prayer, and if you're not comfortable starting the prayer, Lezlie or Rabbi Cattapan are happy to start it with you.
- Aliyah (Torah Blessing and/or Haftorah Blessings). You must know or be willing to learn how to sing or recite the Blessings. You may find recordings of the melodies we use here: https://beth-torah.org/prayer-blessing-melodies
- > Hakafah. You will have the option of carrying the Torah yourself or processing with the worship leader.

Any member may perform the following:

- > Ark Openers/Closers. Open and close the ark during a Torah Service.
- Shalom Squad. Arrive early and greet people as they arrive at the front door. This is one of our most important volunteer opportunities!
- > Ushers. Arrive early, hand out prayer books, and greet people as they enter the sanctuary. This is especially helpful to those visiting our congregation for the first time.


